Abuse Hotline Info. System history checks of persons with whom child or

youth may be placed; provides for child or youth to participate in developing case plan; provides for move to permanency; requires case workers to prepare reports for child's or youth's case management file; requires children or youth to be placed with siblings when possible; requires DCFS or community-based care lead agency to comply with reporting requirements of court; provides for guardian ad litem to report on child's or youth's expressed wishes; requires records to be maintained in complete & accurate manner & be available to guardian ad litem or attorney ad litem at no cost; permits children or youth in care to communicate & organize advocacy plan; requires case plans to include additional information; provides for appearance of child in court to discuss placement informational session; provides for hearing. HB 0025 Relating to Alcohol Abuse by an Expectant Mother Homan

Alcohol Abuse by an Expectant Mother: Designates act "Fetal Alcohol Syndrome Prevention Act"; directs DOH & DCFS to maintain Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders Prevention Network; requires establishment of system for assessing charges for specified services; requires DOH, DCFS, & DABT of DBPR to provide access to information regarding fetal alcohol spectrum disorders on Internet websites; provides for voluntary admission of expectant mother for alcohol abuse treatment services; provides criteria for involuntary admission of expectant mother; requires described health warning signs to be displayed by alcohol beverage vendors; requires DABT of DBPR to produce & distribute signs; directs DOH to establish Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders Diagnostic & Intervention Centers & provide professional training; provides appropriations. HB 0047 Relating to Civil Rights Skidmore

Civil Rights: Prohibits discrimination based on sexual orientation, familial status, & marital status; defines terms; conforms terminology. Effective Date: July 1, 2008.

SB 0074 Relating to Documents Excise Taxes/State Housing Trust Fund Geller

Documents Excise Taxes/State Housing Trust Fund [RPCC]; Removes a limitation on the amount of proceeds from excise taxes on documents which may be deposited into the State Housing Trust Fund on or after a specified date, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

SB 0078 Relating to Child Welfare Professionals Recognition Day Wilson

SB 0088 Relating to School Safety/Bullying and Harassment

Baker

School Safety/Bullying and Harassment [SPCC]; Cites this act as the "Jeffrey Johnston Stand Up for All Students Act" which prohibits bullying or harassment during education programs or activities, on school buses, or through use of data or computer software accessed through computer systems of certain educational institutions. Defines "bullying" as systematically and chronically inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress on one or more students, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: Upon becoming law.

SB 0090 Relating to United States Flag Display/Local Ordinances

Prohibits a county or municipality from enacting or enforcing an ordinance or regulation that prohibits the display of a United States flag by a property owner or tenant in a respectful manner or that requires a permit or payment of a fee to authorize such display, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

SB 0098 Relating to Testing for Infectious Diseases/Juvenile Centers Wilson

Testing for Infectious Diseases/Juvenile Centers [SPCC]; Requires each juvenile assessment center or juvenile detention facility to have a written procedure regarding the testing of juveniles for infectious diseases. Requires DOH to designate two counties having a population of 1.2 million or more and five counties having a population of fewer than 1.2 million to participate in a program to test juveniles for HIV who are referred to or who are under the supervision of DJJ, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

SB 0102 Relating to Pub. Rec./Juveniles/Blood Test Results/DJJ

Wilson

Pub. Rec./Juveniles/Blood Test Results/DJJ [SPCC]; Provides an exemption from public records requirements for serologic blood test results from juveniles referred to or under the supervision of the Department of Juvenile Justice. Provides for future legislative review and repeal under the Open Government Sunset Review Act, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: Contingent.

Provides policy guidelines re nutrition education, physical activity, school-based activities, and nutritional guidelines for food and beverages sold or served on campuses or in the school district, etc EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

HB 0111 Relating to Hurricane Preparedness

Hurricane Preparedness: Provides exemption from sales & use tax for sales of specified tangible personal property during June 1-12, 2008; provides exceptions for sales within public lodging establishments, theme parks, entertainment complexes, or airports; provides appropriation. Effective Date: Upon Becoming a Law. 3/18/2008 HOUSE Now in Economic Expansion & Infrastructure Council

SB 0128 Relating to AIDS Education Grants in Public Schools

Vilsor

AIDS Education Grants in Public Schools [SPCC]; Requires the Department of Education to award grants to public school districts to implement school-based AIDS educational activities. Requires each school district that receives a grant to file an annual report with the Department of Education, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008. 11/28/2007 SENATE Referred to Education Pre-K - 12; Health Policy; Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations

SB 0130 Relating to School-based Health Centers

Wilson

School-based Health Centers [SPCC]; Includes in the definition of "school-based health center," for purposes of the School Health Services Act, an organization that provides at least 25 hours per week of primary care services for adolescents or other school-age children for the majority of the year, primarily provides services onsite at the school, and provides other comprehensive services, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: Upon becoming law. 3/5/2008 SENATE Temporarily postponed by Health Policy

HB 0131 Relating to State Symbols

Attkisson

Wilson

State Symbols: Designates Florida Cracker Horse (Marshtackie) as official state horse; provides for repeal on July 1, 2018, unless reviewed & reenacted by Legislature before that date. Effective Date: July 1, 2008.

SB 0136 Relating to Child Care Personnel Training/Domestic Violence

Child Care Personnel Training/Domestic Violence [SPCC]; Requires each child care facility to establish standards for instructing child care personnel on matters pertaining to domestic violence. Requires that the instruction include not less than 2 hours of training for new personnel and not less than 1 hour of instruction on a periodic and timely basis for experienced personnel each year thereafter, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

HB 0139 Relating to Developmental Disabilities Institutions

Developmental Disabilities Institutions: Requires APD to give written notice to certain specified persons if agency proposes to close or reduce by more than 10 percent resident population of developmental disabilities institution; requires Governor & Cabinet to hold public hearing & that notice of public hearing be given in specified manner; requires agency to conduct study & prepare reports. Effective Date: July 1, 2008. 11/20/2007 HOUSE Withdrawn prior to introduction

SB 0140 Relating to Juvenile Proceedings/Use of Restraints on a Child Wilson

Juvenile Proceedings/Use of Restraints on a Child [LPCC]; Prohibits the use of instruments of restraint, such as handcuffs, chains, irons, or straitjackets, on a child during court proceedings or elsewhere in a courthouse. Provides exceptions. Requires the Department of Juvenile Justice to comply with the Protective Action Response policy whenever mechanical restraints are used, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008. 11/28/2007 SENATE Referred to Criminal Justice; Judiciary

SB 0148 Relating to Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program

Wilson

Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program [SPCC]; Requires that a school-year prekindergarten program delivered by a private provider must comprise up to 720 instructional hours or the same number of instructional hours provided to a student in kindergarten and first grade, if the provider provides instruction in kindergarten and first grade. Provides that a prekindergarten program provided by a public school must comprise at least the same number of instructional hours, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

HB 0149 Relating to Issuance of Disabled Parking Permits

Reed

Issuance of Disabled Parking Permits: Authorizes DHSMV to issue disabled parking permits to health care facility or organization that provides care or treatment to persons meeting qualifications for permit; provides for use of permits by those persons; provides for cancellation of unreturned permits. Effective Date: July 1, 2008. 1/24/2008 HOUSE Withdrawn prior to introduction

SB 0164 Relating to Mental/Nervous/Substance Disorders/Insurance Crist

Mental/Nervous/Substance Disorders/Insurance [EPCC]; Revises the requirements for optional coverage for mental and nervous disorders. Prohibits the durational limits, dollar amounts, deductibles, or coinsurance factors for certain specified illnesses or conditions from being less favorable than those for physical illness. Repeals a specified provision relating to optional coverage for substance abuse impaired persons, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 01/01/2009.

3/21/2008 SENATE Committee Substitute (C1) Filed; Now in General Government Appropriations

SB 0174 Relating to Infant Eye Care/Mandatory Examinations Wilson

Infant Eye Care/Mandatory Examinations [SPCC]; Requires every baby born in a hospital to receive, prior to being discharged from the hospital, an eye examination using an ophthalmoscope and dilation of the pupils for detection of pediatric congenital and ocular abnormalities. Provides an exception to eye examinations when parents file a written objection, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

11/28/2007 SENATE Referred to Health Policy; Banking and Insurance; Health and Human Services Appropriations

SB 0176 Relating to School Nurse Services

Wilson

School Nurse Services [SPCC]; Creates the "One School, One Nurse Act" to provide for funding of a nurse in every public school. Provides matching funds in those communities where interest in school health services is evidenced by the participation of public or private entities in the funding or delivery of school nurse services. Encourages the development of those programs that offer potential for promoting the health of students, etc. APPROPRIATION: \$75,000. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

SB 0178 Relating to Motor Vehicle Insurance/Foster Children Wilson

Motor Vehicle Insurance/Foster Children [SPCC]; Directs the Department of Children and Family Services to create a 3-year pilot program in Miami-Dade County. Provides that the program reimburse foster parents, residential facilities, or foster children who live independently for a portion of the increased costs of motor vehicle insurance for a foster child who has a driver's license. Provides a formula for the amount of reimbursement to be provided, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

SB 0188 Relating to Elderly or Disabled/Criminal Offenses Against Fasano

Elderly or Disabled/Criminal Offenses Against [LPCC]; Cites this act as "The Seniors' Safety Act." Provides for reclassification of felonies committed against the elderly or disabled and for misdemeanors committed against persons 65 years of age or older. Provides for a mandatory term of imprisonment for certain thefts against persons 65 years of age or older. Provides a mandatory term of imprisonment for certain acts of exploitation against an elderly person or disabled adult, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

HB 0189 Relating to Federal Funding for Home Health Services for the Elderly Bucher

Federal Funding for Home Health Services for the Elderly: Urges Congress to increase federal funding for home health services for the elderly. Effective Date: Not Specified

SB 0196 Relating to Miami-Dade County Foster Care Pilot Program Wilson

Miami-Dade County Foster Care Pilot Program [SPCC]; Requires the Department of Children and Family Services to develop an optional continued foster care pilot program in Miami-Dade County. Provides that the participants shall continue to receive foster care services, remain under continued court jurisdiction, and remain in his or her current foster or group home placement or another licensed foster home until he or she leaves the pilot program or reaches the age of 21 years, etc. APPROPRIATION: \$500,000. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

SB 0204 Relating to Health Insurance for Dependent Children

Lynn

Health Insurance for Dependent Children [EPCC]; Revises the criteria governing mandatory coverage of a dependent child under group, blanket, or franchise health insurance policies covering residents of this state. Provides for a dependent child to make a written election to extend coverage or restore previously terminated coverage. Provides guidelines for extended coverage and limitations on additional premiums, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

HB 0215 Relating to Interpreters for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing

Heller

Interpreters for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing: Creates Board of Interpreters for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing under Florida Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf, Inc., to recommend procedures to administer licensing & permitting of interpreter professionals which DBPR shall adopt by rule; provides grounds for board recommendation of revocation or suspension of license or permit or other disciplinary action; provides criminal penalties for specified illegal acts; establishes privilege for certain conversations; provides for voluntary disclosure of certain privileged conversations. Effective Date: July 1, 2008.

SB 0226 Relating to Social Worker Identification

Rich

Social Worker Identification [SPCC]; Defines "social worker" to mean any person who has a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree in social work. Prohibits a social worker from conducting clinical social work unless licensed or certified by the Department of Health. Provides requirements, penalties, and exemptions for using the title "social worker." Requires the Department of Health to adopt rules, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

SB 0232 Relating to Developmental Disabilities Institutions

Fasano

Developmental Disabilities Institutions [SPCC]; Requires the Agency for Persons with Disabilities (APD) to give written notice to the Governor and Cabinet, each resident of the developmental disabilities institution, the resident's guardian, and any other authorized individual if it proposes to close or reduce by more than 10 percent, the resident population of an institution. Requires the Governor and Cabinet to give notice and hold a public hearing on any such proposal, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

HB 0233 Relating to Elderly Persons and Disabled Adults

Anderson

Elderly Persons and Disabled Adults: Reclassifies offense of aggravated abuse of elderly person or disabled adult from second-degree felony to first-degree felony; requires certified law enforcement officers to complete training in identifying & investigating elder abuse & neglect before June 30, 2011. Effective Date: July 1, 2008. 3/19/2008 HOUSE Placed on Calendar, on second reading

SB 0236 Relating to Interpreters for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing

Wise

Interpreters for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing [SPCC]; Creates the Board of Interpreters for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing to recommend procedures to administer licensing and permitting of interpreter professionals which the Department of Business and Professional Development shall adopt by rule. Provides grounds for board recommendation of revocation or suspension of license or permit or other disciplinary action, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

HB 0241 Relating to Homelessness

Culp

Homelessness: Revises definitions applicable to homelessness; increases & revises membership on Council on Homelessness; removes member from obsolete organization & corrects name of member organization on council; revises date of annual report; creates Housing First program; provides methodology & components of program; creates 3-year Youth Housing Continuum Pilot Program; provides eligibility requirements & design of pilot program; requires Connected by 25 in Hillsborough County to provide administrative support; provides Connected by 25 with specified duties; provides appropriation. Effective Date: July 1, 2008.

SB 0248 Relating to Juvenile Sentencing

Wilson

Juvenile Sentencing [LPCC]; Authorizes the court to sentence a juvenile using juvenile sanctions, adult sanctions, or a blend of both sanctions. Requires the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) to file a written report with the sentencing court if the DJJ believes the child's sanction is inappropriate. Authorizes the court to place the child on probation. Requires the DJJ to notify the court no later than 30 days before it discharges a child from a sanction, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 10/01/2008.

SB 0264 Relating to Kidcare Outreach Program Study/Uninsured Children Wilson

Kidcare Outreach Program Study/Uninsured Children [SPCC]; Requires the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability (OPPAGA) to perform a study of the effectiveness of the Kidcare outreach program for uninsured children. Autism Spectrum Disorder [EPCC]; Cites this act as the "Window of Opportunity Act." Requires health insurance plans to provide coverage for screening, diagnosis, intervention, and treatment of autism spectrum disorder in certain children. SB 7002 Relating to Child Abuse, Abandonment, or Neglect Reporting

Children, Families, and Elder Affairs

Child Abuse, Abandonment, or Neglect Reporting; Requires the Department of Children and Family Services to annually report to the Legislature information concerning reports, investigations, and prosecutions involving child abuse, abandonment, or neglect, investigations and fines imposed for false reports, and reports resulting in prosecution, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

SB 7008 Relating to Child Welfare

Children, Families, and Elder Affairs

Child Welfare; Authorizes the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) to adopt rules providing for locating and recovering missing children who are involved with the DCFS. Requires that the DCFS, the community-based care provider, or the sheriff's office file a report following a determination that a child involved with the DCFS is missing, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2008.

Health Policy

Medicaid Waiver Program/Alzheimer's Patients; Extends the authority to continue the waiver program. Requires that the findings and recommendations be submitted to the Legislature by February 1, 2010, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: Upon becoming law.
