PROPOSED 2001 - 2002 BUDGETS*

A Look at Some Lines . . .

As mentioned in last week's *Legislative Link*, the Florida House and Senate have both passed their respective 2001-2002 state budgets. More than \$300 million apart, the budgets will be the focus of behind the scenes action and conference committee deliberation over the next few weeks. As this *Legislative Link* went to press, neither the Senate nor the House had identified their conferees. Below is a comparison of some of the Human Services and Education lines in the proposed budgets that are of interest to United Way agencies, and others.
